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Impact and Needs and Contact Us Greetings to the Inclusive Technology of Washington community!

Amazing how time flies! It is already March, and we skipped over our February newsletter! We have been busy around here, and have lots of updates to share with you! So let's get started...

**Specialized Habilitation:** We have about a dozen students who have either already started their Specialized Habilitation (also known as Life Skills) classes, or are about to begin them! **Pre-Vocational:** Inclusive Technology of Washington is now capable of receiving payments from the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation for pre-vocational instruction! We are looking for 6-10 students interested in joining a pilot program with us, to collaborate with DVR to develop a pathway to employment. This intense program would involve pre-learning various skills necessary to (at a later date) complete college courses (or other certification classes) that would lend themselves to employment in a technology-related field. Our role would not be to offer the college classes per se, but to build the student's skills ahead of time to prepare them for being capable of successfully navigating the class. This would all be accomplished on an individual goal basis, based on the results of their person centered planning meeting. Feel free to contact us for more information if interested!

**Girl Scouts:** We have a great lineup Girl Scout summer Live Online "day camp" programs! For those who are new to this offering, every summer we meet with Girl Scotus online for a week, for Live Online classes. Over the course of the week, the girls earn up to three journeys (which are leadership-based "super badges"). By doing so, they have an opportunity to earn the "Summit Award" for their earning of three journeys. This program involves also helping them implement a "take action" service project… so they are helping to make the world a better place while also becoming tomorrow's future leaders! 

Mr. Anwar Beleku, Specialized Habilitation Instructor, has always been passionate about assisting people in developing life skills, and he discovered that specialized habilitation enabled him to combine education, technology, and creativity to meet a wide range of needs. Specialized habilitation is more than just educating; it is also about empowering people to live more independently and securely. This allows the learner to concentrate on skill development in daily life, communication, and creative expression using technology. Overall, the most fulfilling moment at Inclusive Technology of Washington is seeing participants achieve what they once thought was impossible; these are the moments that make this work so rewarding, according to Mr. Beleku.

Anwar designed an interactive learning tool, which led to a project he is particularly proud of: developing an accessible digital skills program that allows individuals with special needs to explore creative and technical fields, as well as a code we created for finance exchange.

When Anwar is not working, he enjoys hiking and working with technology, which ranges from AWS server installation to creative interests such as digital art and videography.

Finally, the best advice that he received, which applies to all of us, is "Progress is progress, no matter how small".
